Program Abstract.....

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, aka “the Stimulus Bill,” signed into Law in February 2009 included \$19.2 Billion, which is intended to be used to increase the use of EHR by physicians and hospitals. This portion of the bill is called the HITECH ACT. The intended use of the \$19.2 billion will be for incentive payments, grants and loans. This session delivers information you need to get ready for big changes in healthcare, and specifically, how the adoption of Electronic Health Records (EHR) can transform healthcare and enhance financial performance. This program will bring you up to speed on where to begin with EHR adoption and how to start thinking about the process to ensure that you make the best purchasing and adoption preparations. GUEST SPEAKERS

Dr. Mike O'Dell

Dr. O'Dell serves as the Director of Medical Education at North Mississippi Medical Center (NMMC), Tupelo, MS. Mike received his Bachelors degree from Kansas State University in 1974 and received his Doctorate of Medicine in 1977 from the University of Kansas Medical Center in Kansas City. He completed his Masters Degree in Health Care Administration at the University of Alabama-Birmingham in 2005. Mike is active in many national, regional, and community activities. He is the past Chair for the American Academy of Family Physicians Commission on Quality and Practice and serves on the Physician Engagement Advisory Committee for the Joint Commission. He is serving on several national committees regarding the continuum of patient care and chronic care management. He is a Governor's Appointee to the Mississippi Hospital Equipment and Financing Authority (the state's bond agency for health care facilities), recently served as Chair for Mississippi's Medicaid Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee, and is also appointed to the Mississippi Health Information Task Force. He is the current President of the Mississippi Academy of Family Physicians. He is an elected member of Mississippi State Medical Association's Committee on Education and is an Associate editor for the MSMA Journal. He is President Elect of the Tupelo Rotary Club. Mike serves on the Board of Directors for Good Samaritan Free Clinic and CatchKids. He is an ordained elder in the Presbyterian Church (PCUSA).

Jeffery Daigrepoint

Jeffery Daigrepoint, a senior vice president of Coker Group, specializes in health care automation, strategic planning, operations, and deployment of fully integrated information systems for medical practices and hospitals. A popular program speaker, Jeffery is frequently engaged by highly respected organizations across the nation. Accomplishments include the authorship of several publications, and Mr. Daigrepoint is often interviewed in industry publications. James S. McIlwain, MD

Dr. James S. McIlwain of Clinton has served as Information & Quality Healthcare (IQH) president since 1997. His experience with the Medicare quality improvement organization includes serving as medical director, clinical coordinator, review physician and member of the board of directors. He was appointed by the office of the Governor to be a member of the Southern Governor's Association (SGA) Gulf Coast Health Information Technology Task Force, and was named co-chair of the Governor's state task force for HIT/HIE adoption. He has served as chief of the medical staff at Hinds General Hospital. He was also the medical director at Methodist Medical Center Hospital. Certified by the American Board of Quality Assurance and Utilization Review Physicians and the American Board of Family Practice, he is active with the Mississippi State Medical Association, he has served as a delegate to the American Medical Association. His degrees are from Mississippi State University and the University of Mississippi Medical School. He completed post-graduate training at the Medical Center Hospital in Columbus, Georgia, and served as Captain in the United States Army Medical Corps from 1968 to 1970. A former president of the board of trustees of the Clinton School District, he is a lay minister with the Methodist Church, and has served on numerous medical missions to other countries.
